Summary of feedback:

Q8 & Q 9. What can we do to improve the event? Any additional comments or suggestions?

Summary of feedback:

More seating around the foyer area. More creative arts to stimulate (music or dance). Allow time for Questions & Answers in workshops (for audience participation). Allow people to attend more than one workshop. More time for each workshop. More time after workshops for people to mingle and discuss workshop. Shorter introductions in theatre. Workshop summaries (clearer/better prepared or don't have). Include Pagans. Give out a showbag that includes booklet and leaflets. Make coffee/tea/juice and snacks available at workshops. Location of conference should be more central (easy to access via transport). Too many speakers at the theatre. Conference should run for a whole day. Too many panellists in each workshop. Add a short prayer from each faith tradition and meditation music. Where was the media? Order more fruit and more food. Get real coffee.
